
Why Change is Necessary



VIOLENCE reduction unit

Violence is preventable, not inevitable.

Crime Type	2010	2014	% Difference
Murder	59	35	-41%
Attempt Murder	259	106	-60%
GBH	2973	1611	-46%
Common Assault	29018	20562	-30%
Robbery	1140	529	-54%
Assault W/I to Rob	317	160	-50%


Objectives

- To significantly reduce crime and ASB by;
 - Identifying those at risk of becoming criminalised earlier and doing something about it
 - Provide a positive alternative to offending
 - Engaging positively not punitively
 - Helping them help themselves (not doing things for them)
 - Engaging partners
 - Building more resilient communities
 - **Linking those who need the most help to support**
 - Using the criminal justice system appropriately
 - Understanding the complexities involved, to reduce crime, sustainably in a different way

4 x arrest (SAC and violence) plus custodial sentence 2015, 30 intel logs, suspected 12 offences

PPO, 3 x arrests (last 12 months), suspected 2 offences, 58 previous in force arrests

15 arrests (last 12 months), 5 x overdoses whilst in police custody in 2015.

Juvenile, 1 arrests, 5 suspected violence offences

29 Previous arrests most for violence, 3 in past 12 months. Suspected of 10 offences last 12 months
